- Spelling skills.



1. A symbol for everlasting life, often worn as an amulet on the wrist or ankle.
2. The symbol for the royalty that ruled a
particular region in Egypt, often worn on the headdress of the pharaoh.
3. The symbol for the union of upper and lower Egypt into one land, first used by King Menes.
4. These symbolic figures, called shabtis, represent the workers in the afterlife that would till the soil in the Field of Reeds for the dead pharaoh.
5. The symbol for protection and mysticism, said to come from Horus.
6. The symbols for leadership and royalty, seen in the hands of Osiris and often pictured in the hands of the pharaohs.
7. This symbol represented King Akhenaten's belief in one god called Aten.
8. A symbol of the pharaoh, Queen Hatshepsut also wore one.
9. A symbol believed to have magical powers for healing and mysticism today.
10. The symbol for judgment, used to determine whether or not a soul is noble and pure enough to enter an afterlife in the Field of Reeds. Today the symbol represents justice.
11. The sacred symbol for Amon-Re, the sun god, who carried his daily ball of fire across the sky. It was often used as an amulet or a personal seal and represented everlasting life.
12. The symbol for a particular region in Egypt and a great dynasty, often seen drawn on the chest of a mummy.
