

DOLPHIN MOBILE

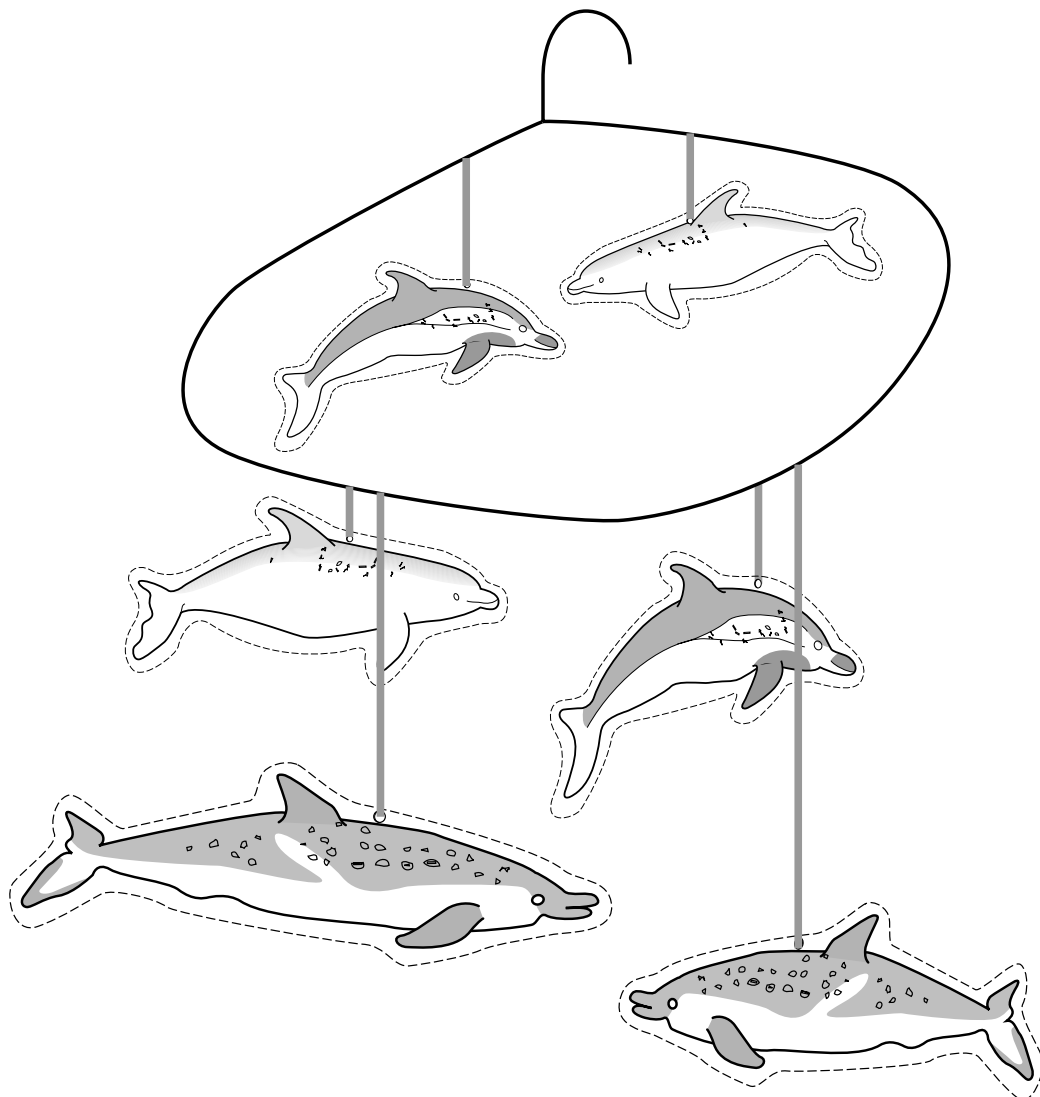
Many kinds of animal life forms live in the ocean—even some mammals. A dolphin is an air breathing mammal that blows (spouts) to exhale air and it can make several different noises by using an air passage.

Materials:

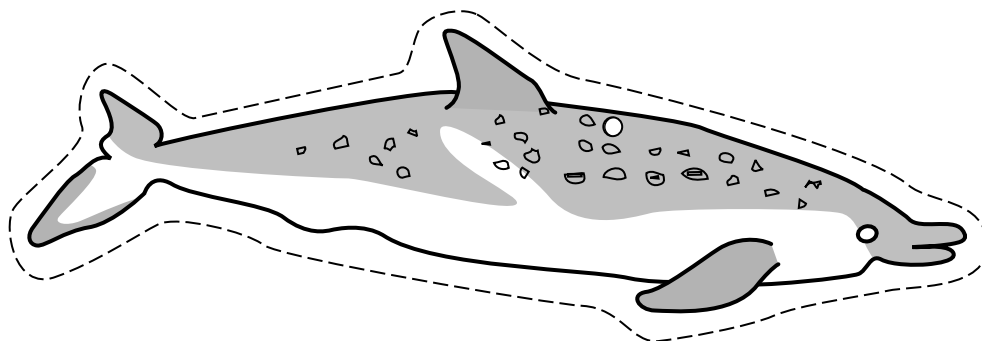
- Crayons and/or markers
- Duplication of DOLPHIN CUTOUTS — *two sheets per student*
- Hole punch
- Ribbon or string — *three to six pieces (varying lengths) per student*
- Wire coat hanger — *one per student*

Directions:

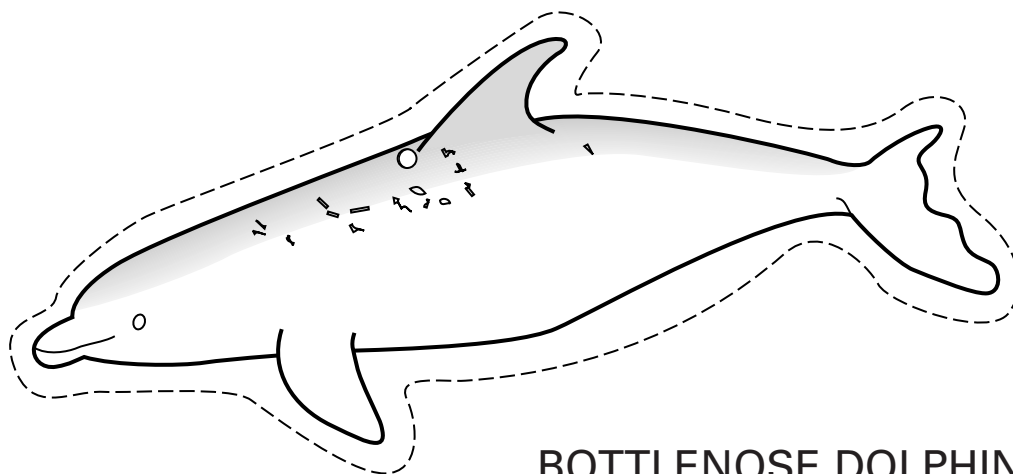
1. Pull a wire coat hanger into any shape. (Do not dismantle the hanger.)
2. Cut out dolphins and color them.
3. Write the dolphins' names on the back of each dolphin.
4. Punch a hole somewhere along the top of each dolphin or punch a hole in the empty circle provided on top of the dolphin.
5. Tie the dolphins with string or ribbon and hang them from the hanger.
6. Give your finished mobile to your teacher to display in the classroom.



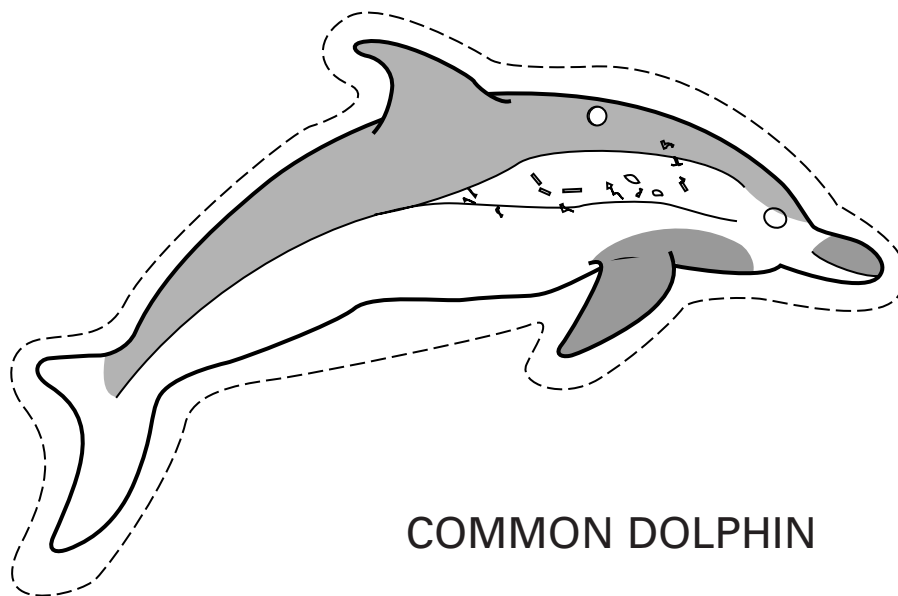
DOLPHIN CUTOUTS
