
Whether you write a note to a friend, write your thoughts in a diary or journal, make a sign to ask for help in finding a lost pet, or write "This belongs to" and your name on a notebook, you are using words to communicate with yourself or others.

So what words will you choose to use in your writing? And how will you organize these words on paper or the computer screen? The kind of writing you do depends on the words you choose to use and how you choose to use them.

Another Way to Say It



(Synonyms, Metaphors, Similes)

Three children describe a runner but they all use different words! And here are more words that might be used to describe the runner:



She's speedy!


She's like Jackie Joyner-Kersee!

She's a streak of lightning!

Can you think of more ways to describe the runner?

The words <u>quick</u> and <u>speedy</u> are called <u>synonyms</u>. Synonyms are words that mean the same or nearly the same.

The words "a streak of lightning" and "a racehorse" are called <u>metaphors</u>. A metaphor compares one thing to another. The runner's speed is compared to the speed of a racehorse or a flash of lightning.




The words "as fast as a speeding bullet" and "like Jackie Joyner-Kersee" are called <u>similes</u>. A simile uses the words <u>like</u> or <u>as</u> to compare one thing to another. The runner's speed is compared to a bullet's speed or the speed of champion runner Jackie Joyner-Kersee.

Metaphors and similes are <u>figures of speech</u> or <u>figurative language</u>. As a writer, you want your reader to be able to "picture" what you are saying.

So you may want to use synonyms and figures of speech to help you "paint" your pictures.

A <u>cliché</u> is a figure of speech that is used so often that it is said to be "overworked." You could use the cliché "runs like a racehorse" to describe the runner. But your language would be more original if you said the



runner was "like a champion sprinter" or "as swift as a cheetah."

You will find many synonyms and figures of speech on the following pages. Basic words are listed alphabetically in dark type. Under each basic word you will find synonyms, metaphors, and similes. You will want to choose the word or words that say exactly what you want to say. You may even want to add some of your own ideas to the lists.

(Compound Words)




The two words ground and hog are "glued" together to make one word. One word made from two smaller words is a <u>compound word</u>.

What happens to the meanings of the little words? Sometimes the meanings change. For example, <u>understand</u> is a compound word. The little words <u>under</u> and <u>stand</u> are put together. But <u>understand</u> does not mean to stand under something! And a <u>brainstorm</u> is a good idea—it is not really a storm inside of the brain!





Word Play

(Onomatopoeia, Palindromes, Hink-Pinks, Hinky-Pinkys)



Writers work with words. Writers also play with words. You can have fun with the sounds of words. You can put words next to each other to say funny or odd things. You can turn a word's letters around to make a different word. You can even make up or "coin" new words whenever you want.

Here are some lists of Sound Words, Palindromes, Hink-Pinks, and Hinky-Pinkys. You may just want to play with these words and their sounds. Or you may want to use some of these fun words in your writing.

Onomatopoeia (Sound Words)

Listen! What sounds do you hear around you? Sound words, or <u>onomatopoeia</u>, are words that spell actual sounds.

Sometimes every letter of a sound word is written in capital letters.

OINK!

Sometimes a sound word is written again and again.

DRIP! DRIP! DRIP!

Sometimes the first or last letter of a sound word is repeated:

r-r-ring who-o-o-o

And sometimes the letters of a sound word are stretched out:

CREAK!




What is a rhyming sound?

Two words that rhyme have the same ending sound. Their ending sound is called a <u>rhyming sound</u>.

Rhyming sounds are all around you. You hear rhyming sounds in nursery rhymes. You also hear rhyming sounds in poems and songs and jump-rope jingles.

A rhyming sound always begins with a vowel. A rhyming sound can be written by writing the alphabet letter or letters that you hear in that sound. For example, the rhyming sound at the



Jack and Jill went up the hill . . .



Jack Sprat could eat no fat . . .

ends of the words <u>dock</u> and <u>clock</u> can be written <u>ok</u>. The rhyming sound in <u>Jill</u> and <u>hill</u> can be written <u>il</u>. And the rhyming sound in <u>Sprat</u> and <u>fat</u> can be written <u>at</u>.

What is a rhyming-word family? Rhyming words can be grouped into families—just like people! In a rhyming-word family, every word has the same ending sound.

Here are two families of rhyming words. One family includes words that end in the <u>at</u> sound. So we might call that family the "<u>at</u> as in <u>fat</u>" family. The other family of words might be called the "<u>ath</u> as in <u>math</u>" family.

Some human families have many people in them. And some human families are small, with only two or three people. Like human families, rhyming-word families may be large or small. Some rhyming-word families have many words in them. Others have few. How do I find words that rhyme? More than 200 rhyming-word families are listed on the following pages. So how will you find any one family of rhyming words? Let's find out!

Suppose you want to find the family of words that rhyme with the word toes. To find the words that rhyme with toes, you'll need to know the ending sound in the word. Then you'll need to know which alphabet letters could spell that sound. So you'll need to answer two questions:

Question #1: What is the ending sound in the word <u>toes</u>?

Your Answer: I hear the sound of long \underline{o} and the sound that the letter \underline{z} makes.

Question #2: What alphabet letter or letters could spell that ending sound?


Your Answer: The letters <u>oz</u> could spell that sound.

Now you're ready to look for <u>oz</u> in the lists of rhyming words on the following pages. The families of rhyming words are listed in alphabetical order under the vowels A, E, I, O, and U. Remember, a rhyming sound always begins with a vowel. So the family of <u>oz</u> words will be found under the vowel **O**.

Turn to page 163 in this book. Look for the large vowel letter **O**. Look down the lists of words under the large vowel **O**. You will find <u>oz</u> as in <u>nose</u> on page 177. Do the words <u>toes</u> and <u>nose</u> rhyme? Yes! All the words in the <u>oz</u> as in <u>nose</u> family rhyme with the word <u>toes</u>.

Wow! Look at all those words that rhyme with the word <u>toes</u>.
Count them . . . twenty-two words!

What a large family!



And guess what! There are even more words that rhyme with the word <u>toes</u>. You may want to add other words, like <u>throws</u> or a girl's name <u>Rose</u>.

Sometimes the ending sound you hear in a word can be written different ways. For example, the ending sound you hear in the word <u>moose</u> might be written <u>us</u> or <u>oos</u>. So you will find words that rhyme with the word <u>moose</u> listed under the vowel **O** (<u>oos</u> as in <u>moose</u>) and under the vowel **U** (<u>us</u> as in <u>moose</u>).

Now and then, you may find a word that doesn't seem to rhyme with the other words in a family. That's because different people say some words in different ways.

Remember: any time you have a word and want to find its family of rhyming words, you begin by asking (and answering!) two questions:

- 1. What is the ending sound in your word?
- 2. What alphabet letters could spell that ending sound?

Then you can use the list of rhyming-word families to find just what you want!

What is a STEP AHEAD list of words?

The word <u>nose</u> has one syllable. And so do the first twenty-two words in the family of words that rhyme with the word <u>nose</u>.**

So what are those other eight words, like <u>borrows</u> and <u>heroes</u> and <u>windows</u>? Those longer words also rhyme with the words <u>nose</u> and <u>toes</u>. But when you say one of those longer words, you don't hear just one syllable. You hear two syllables!

Sometimes when you are writing, you may want to use a longer word that rhymes with a short word. That's when you will want to use one of the **STEP AHEAD** lists of two-syllable words.

Glossary

Antonym

A word that means the opposite of another word.

Cliché

A figure of speech that is overused.

Compound word

A word made up of two or more smaller words.

Contraction

A short form of two words. An apostrophe is used in place of a missing letter or letters.

Dewey Decimal System

A system that organizes library books into ten main categories.

Ellipsis

Three periods used when one or more words have been left out.

Figurative language

Phrases whose meanings are different from their literal or real meanings.

Figure of speech

A phrase that has a meaning different from its literal or real meaning.

Formal writing

Writing, such as a business letter or manuscript, that is meant to be read by people other than oneself or friends.



Hink-pink

A pair of one-syllable rhyming words that suggest an interesting or funny idea.

Hinky-pinky

A pair of two-syllable rhyming words that suggest an interesting or funny idea.

Homograph

A word that is spelled like another word but has a different meaning and is sometimes pronounced differently.

Homophone

A word that sounds like another word but has a different spelling and different meaning.

Informal writing

Writing, such as notes or friendly letters, that is meant to be read by oneself or friends.

Library of Congress System

A system that organizes library books into main categories noted by a letter of the alphabet.

Metaphor


