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To the Teacher

Where Is It? World Geography Fun for Middle School is designed to make the study of place geography interesting and entertaining for both students and teacher. With this in mind, two puzzles and a generous selection of quiz questions are provided for the study of each continent except Antarctica, which has one puzzle. In addition there are a pretest, two location exercises, and a review page for the place geography of each continent. Several special puzzle pages are also included to direct student attention and learning to specific areas of geographic importance.

The puzzles and study pages in Where Is It? encourage students to acquire a basic understanding of world place geography. They call upon students to make use of map and atlas skills. In addition to locating the required answers, students receive practice in use of direction, scale of distance, and location by use of latitude and longitude.

The puzzles and study pages for each continent are set up in similar manner so you and your students know exactly what to expect as you move from continent to continent. You will most likely wish to study the place geography of one continent at a time. However, each puzzle and study page is independent of all others. Should you wish to work on latitude and longitude location, for example, there is no reason why you can't utilize those specific study pages from more than one continent to provide extended practice in this skill during a short time frame.

Each continent unit begins with a **Pretest**. Use this page in whatever manner best fits the needs of your class. It gives you and your students a quick check of what they know and do not know about the place geography of a given continent. Since the Pretest provides an overview of the continent, both political and physical geography are covered. It is suggested that students complete as much of the page as possible without reference to a map or an atlas. Then, if you wish, they may turn to a map or an atlas to check their answers and to complete the remainder of the page. Depending upon the ability levels of your students, you may wish to consider having them work with partners as they take the Pretest.

Another use of the Pretest is to have your students complete this page without the use of a map or atlas as a study page before taking a formal test. If you wish, allow students to form study groups and base their test preparation on the Pretest.

A Political Features Puzzle comes next in all units except Antarctica. All answers required to complete this interlocking puzzle are names of cities, states, and nations. This puzzle is self-checking in that only correct answers will interlock correctly. Because Antarctica has few political features, only one puzzle concentrating on physical features has been included.

The second puzzle in each unit is a **Physical Features Puzzle** whose answers are the names of land and water features. These include mountain ranges, bays, gulfs, rivers, oceans, islands, etc. This puzzle is also self-checking. Only the correct answer will fill the answer spaces provided and, at the same time, correctly interlock with the vertical phrase that is spelled out by boxed letters in the puzzle.

Each unit includes a **Locating Features by Direction and Distance** study page requiring the students to use their knowledge of direction and a scale of distance in order to locate the political or physical geography features described. After your students have completed this study page you may wish to have them take part in individual or small-group activities in which they devise their own direction and distance clues for features of their choosing. Students can use these clues in group competitions in which a clue is read aloud and the first group to locate the desired feature scores a point.

A second study page, Locating Features Using Latitude and Longitude, gives your students an opportunity to practice their skills of location. The features they locate are both political and physical.

Again, if you wish, consider having small groups of students set up their own latitude and longitude locations. As was suggested for student-made direction and distance questions, you can use their latitude and longitude locations as the basis for a quick class competition.

From time to time, one additional study-puzzle will be included to call attention to a specific area of importance. For instance, at the end of the unit on Europe is a study-puzzle dealing with the former Soviet Union. This study-puzzle helps make the transition from Europe to Asia.

The final study page for each continent is a **Review** page in which students are given the names of twenty geographic features that are a mix of political and physical features. The students are asked to use a map or an atlas to locate these features and then write a clue that would lead others to locate that specific feature. An example is given along with two clues that would be correct answers for this example. Not only does the Review page provide students with a different review approach, it also encourages them to look carefully at each location in terms of its place on the continent.

An excellent summation activity is to have each student read aloud one of his or her clues and have the class identify the feature described. This activity can be used with your entire class or as a small-group project. You might also consider having students write three or four of their clues on a sheet of paper and then exchange papers with a partner. Each partner then attempts to identify the feature from the clues provided.

A generous selection of **Quiz Questions** is provided for each continent. For all continents except Antarctica, political feature questions and physical feature questions are listed separately. In addition, each set of questions is divided into those that are

more basic and those that require a bit more knowledge. When these questions are used for quiz contests, the basic questions might be scored as five-point questions and the more difficult questions as ten-point questions.

The Quiz Questions are designed to be used as an oral review, providing a high level of student interest and participation. They may also provide the basis for a final teacher-constructed test for each continent. If you wish, use some of the Quiz Questions as an oral test to determine whether the class is prepared to take a more formal final test.

Quiz Questions not only allow for interesting review, they also serve as a teaching means. As students take part in a quiz contest, they are constantly recalling information and remembering facts given by others who respond correctly to such questions. Class quiz contests are an excellent reward activity which students anticipate and enjoy.

There is no limit to the number of ways you and your students may use the Quiz Questions. You may conduct class quizzes during which students are divided into teams or compete as individuals. Students may form small groups and conduct their own quiz contests.

One successful way to conduct a class quiz is to allow the student or team giving a correct response to choose the next question. For example, a student who has correctly answered a question might request that the next question be a ten-point question on physical features or a five-point political geography question. Another approach is to have the quiz moderator, in most cases the teacher, simply make the choice as to which category and level of difficulty the next question will be.

Individual students can challenge others so that a given question is directed toward two students. Questions may be directed to the entire class when the class is divided into teams. In such a case, the first hand up is allowed a chance to answer. (Identifying the first hand up can be a real challenge for the moderator, by the way.) It is probably best to award points for correct answers but not to deduct for incorrect responses.

Experiment to determine how you and your classes can utilize the Quiz Questions to best advantage. Don't be concerned about reusing given questions if you conduct several quizzes on the same continent either as reward or review activities. Try not to repeat the same question in a single quiz contest, of course.

The puzzles, study pages, and Quiz Questions included in *Where Is It?* provide the basis for enjoyable study of world place geography. Feel free to use these materials in any manner best suited to your needs and those of your students.


